## HOME OF THE KNIGHTS

### International Baccalaureate Programme 2022-23 School Profile

#### SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Our school district is the seventh largest in the country, enrolling well over 200,000 students (K-12). Robinson High School opened in 1959 with 42 rooms and 1200 students. It was built to relieve overcrowding at nearby Plant High School. The school is in close proximity to MacDill Air Force Base which houses Special Operations Command (SOCOM) and Central Command (CENTCOM). The student body quickly grew to over 2000 students by the early 70's. With the downsizing of the US Military in the 1980's, the population quickly dwindled. During the 2006-2007 school year, Robinson High School became the third high school in Hillsborough County to have an International Baccalaureate Program. The first class of IB students graduated in 2010. Robinson also has an Aeronautical program where students can take Dual Enrollment classes certified by Embry Riddle University. Our students literally take flight! Today our enrollment is 1375 students. We are proud of our traditions and the addition of an International Baccalaureate Program. Robinson High School has been accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). Robinson High School earned an "A" rating for the 2021-2022 school year by the Florida Department of Education.

#### THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAMME

Students must apply to the program with a selection process that is merit based. It is intended for the highly motivated high school students who also fit the IB Learner Profile. The IBP is a magnet program, drawing from 14 public middle schools and 18 private/charter schools in Hillsborough County. We admit approximately 35% of our applicants. We are a four-year program, and all students are full diploma candidates. Ninth and tenth grade is pre-IB with all 9<sup>th</sup> graders taking Inquiry Skills. During the junior and senior years, students take three IB classes at the standard level (SL), three at the higher level (HL), and Theory of Knowledge. In some rare cases students can choose to take 4 HL classes and 2 SL classes. Our average IB Diploma pass rate has been 95% over the past eight years. Our students attend IB classes with other IB students as well as elective classes with traditional program students. We are on a block schedule where students attend four classes per day with a total of eight classes in their schedule. We offer a built-in, highly structured and academically focused study hall as one of those classes. As a result, our students can participate widely in sports, student government, honor societies, vocational organizations, and service clubs. Students can also elect to take traditional electives such as band, orchestra, theater, or vocational electives with traditional students. This is in lieu of the full study hall. In addition to the coursework listed on page 2, each student must complete 150 hours of CAS (Creativity, Action and Service), and write two independently scored essays. One is 4,000-word, independent research paper referred to as an Extended Essay (EE). The other essay is linked to the Theory of Knowledge (TOK) course. Students take written exams for each Diploma Programme IB course (SL or HL). They are graded by the International Baccalaureate Organization and scores are reported on a scale of 1 to 7 with 7 being the highest score. The IB Diploma is awarded during the first week in July after graduation.

## GPA & TRANSCRIPTS

The grade point average is cumulative and includes high school courses taken in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades as well as courses taken in grades 9-12. All courses taken are included in the computation of the GPA. All Pre-IB and Honors courses are designated by an I or Y in the course flag column of the transcript and earn an extra weight of .04 per semester per course. All Dual Enrollment AP courses and IB courses are designated by a Z in the course flag column and earn an extra weight of .08 per course per semester. Students are ranked countywide. We rank our students countywide because we are a magnet school and students are drawn from the entire district. **District policy prohibits our ranking students within Robinson High School senior class.** Robinson High School has two valedictorians and two salutatorians – one from the IBP and one from the traditional senior class.
